

History of the House St.-Jürgen-Straße 14

May 15th, 1799

1949

Entry in the municipal archive: "Boy Hansen, captain in Norder St. Jürgen owing thereof a house of 4 compartments with a chimney in Norder St. Jürgen (vol. 3 Fol. 29)"

Boy Hansen

- Was the son of the captain Boy Hansen and his wife Marike, née Hansen (she went bankrupt after the death of her husband in 1810);
- Married 1796 Ingeborg Elertz, daughter of the captain Isaac Elertz in St. Jürgen and his wife Anna, née Asmussen;
- Acquired (presumably as the dowry of his wife) the property Norder St. Jürgen180 (today's St.-Jürgen-Straße 14);

Boy Hansen commanded from 1791 till 1810 three ships:

1791 -1793 Die Einigkeit, yacht, 5-man crew,

19.5 commercial tonnage (c. t.)

1794 - 1796 *Christina*, yacht ,4-man crew,13.5 c. t.

1797 - 1810 *Triton*, gelass, 7-man crew, 59 c. t. later 49 c. t.

The Triton was the most significant ship. The owners were Hans Petersen Schmidt and Jürgen Nicolai Fries. It was built in Steinberghaff 1796. Sailing areas: Baltic, North Sea, Mediterranean.

Oct. 21 st , 1852	from Boy Hansen's widow Ingeborg to Calle Petersen, Sonderburg, ship owning captain, bought for 1280 imperial thalers ver. (Vol. 3 Fol. 619, Urbarium pag. A52, No. 180) - (Entry Vol. 1, p. 452)
March 3, 1874	Norder- and Süder-St-Jürgen are incorporated into Flensburg.
1903 - 1907	Construction of the Church of St. Juergen
1891 - 1899	Johann Paul Buchholz, Barber, Shop: Rathausstraße 10
1899 - 1919	Joh. Chr. Jensen, "mineral water manufacturer"
1899	Construction of the rear building, in which there was a fountain. Here
	mineral water was bottled, delivered and sold at markets.
1919 - 1941	Friedrich Hoffmann, "mineral water manufacturer"

Rear House: Erich Schwarz built and sold violins

1941 - 1950 Arnold Hoffmann, baker, worked at the bread factory Rerup, Großer Straße 77-79 (moved on 21.12.1959 with wife and four children by ship from Hamburg to Australia) Jan. 1950 - 1966 Petersen, in the courtyard later acceptance point of a galvanizer in Neumünster Jan. 1966 - 1967 Community of heirs Petersen, from 1967 Horst Petersen Nov. 1967 - 1979 Horst Petersen, seller at the car dealership Thurner & Co 1972 - 1973 major renovation, oil central heating, new windows, from three apartments become 4 small rental apartments Jan. 1973 Sale of the 41 sqm large part of the property south of the house to the neighboring joinery June 1979 - 1984 Manfred Schlechter and Kirsten Brandstrup Sept. 5th, 1984 Kirsten and Herbert Leupelt Oct./Dec. 1984 gradual refurbishment of the entire front and rear house until 1992 Nov. 1984 Discovery of a mural on the north wall of the 1st floor April - Dec. 1986 Restoration of the mural by three restorers Nov. 30th, 1990 The residential building St-Jürgen-Straße 14 is listed as a historical monument

p. 294:

"Two-storey eaves house with plastered facade and narrow terrace framed by field stone retaining wall, built in the last quarter of the 18th century. Inside the upper floor room with painted longitudinal wall, here within the painted division in three fields each surrounded by stylized tendrils ovals with allegorical representations of the four temperaments, the five senses and the three religions Jewish, Christianity and Islam, probably executed around 1800. The paintings were based on copper engravings by Bernhard Rode from the 1788 publication by Karl Wilhelm Ramler in Berlin, Allegorical Figures for the Use of Visual Artists."
